In 2022 the Erie Downtown Partnership delivered its largest scope of work to its members since its inception in 2004. Downtown events and activation scaled to almost 150, new park infrastructure was piloted, downtown event attendance tripled to 77,500, the Downtown Design Guidelines were completed, more grant and corporate funding was received for programs and projects, more gift certificates were sold, and more people came back to downtown. Design Guidelines

The Erie Downtown Partnership developed the first Design Guidelines and Standards resource to help property owners and developers consider maintenance and restoration best practices to improve the built environment.

The project study area is from 2nd Street up to 14th Street on both the east and west sides of State Street. The guide considers downtown Erie's unique and eclectic building architecture, history, and context with adjoining neighborhoods and Historic Districts.

Cleveland-based firm Perspectus facilitated public input sessions and the development of the guide, including a maintenance check list. This project was made possible by a grant from the Erie County Gaming Revenue Authority and the Pennsylvania Historical & Museum Commission.

The guide is available for review and download at www.eriedowntown.com. Façade and preservation workshops will be planned as companion education for users of the guide.

Events

2022 was a landmark year for events in Downtown.

The totals below represent our **largest community impact so far** through our events calendar. Compared to last year's numbers, our impact has grown substantially in a short amount of time:

EDP saw a huge increase in engagement per event in 2022, helped by an investment into events marketing and several partnerships like our media partnership with Lily Broadcasting for our Skating Rink and Winter Events. These marketing investments helped us to draw nearly 4x the crowd with only 1.4x as many events. With attendance numbers affected by the pandemic in 2020, you can more clearly compare the progress over the past four years by using the engagement ratio, which is how many people were engaged per dollar spent:

The ice-skating rink was a new addition to winter programming allowing for ongoing promotional opportunities with downtown businesses.

The rink launched on Small Business Saturday and hosted almost 2000 skaters over the season and an additional 500 spectators.

Our rink team has worked hard to gain public feedback and provide a safe and fun rink experience for everyone. The rink will be further enhanced with additional infrastructure and programming next season.

We extend a special thank you to rink manager, Kim Smith-McMahon, who oversaw rink operations and the rink team throughout the three-month season.

The rink was made possible by generous support from Erie Insurance through the PA Department of Community and Economic Development's Neighborhood Assistance Program Tax Credit. Additional support was provided by A.M. Higley, the City of Erie, and Jason Troyer of Millcraft Barns.

BUSINESS Support and Marketing

As the Downtown Improvement District our main focus is to provide programs and services that benefit our downtown's businesses and add economic vibrancy. In 2022 the Erie Downtown Partnership staff provided direct assistance to 445 downtown businesses.

Dountoun Sift Certificates

The Downtown Gift Certificate Program had its best year ever with \$79,710 in sales, just surpassing our 2020 record. We had a great partner in Erie Insurance who collaborated with us on a special gift certificate incentive program for their employees. Through this unique initiative we were able to provide \$20,400 in sales to downtown businesses over a three-month period.

Small Business Saturday

Our celebration of Small Business Saturday continued to grow this year, reaching nearly 5,000 people and involving over 100 local small and micro businesses. In addition to the vendor events in several locations Downtown, we also held the grand opening of the Skating Rink in Perry Square. Our efforts to market Downtown as a destination for holiday shopping and activities saw over 17,000 people drawn to Downtown throughout the holiday season to shop, dine, and attend events. Events and activation around the major holiday shopping season helped to boost the impact of the season for our member businesses in the Downtown district, helping them to take full advantage of their busiest time of the year.



2022 FINANCIALS

The Erie Downtown Partnership's 2022 operating budget was \$1.3 million, with the majority of funding being directly allocated toward delivery of programs and services. The most recent audit, completed in May of 2022, is available at our office or online.

We were pleased to increase our grant and corporate giving income to \$625,000, which is an \$81,085 increase from 2021.

What's Next

The Erie Downtown Partnership continues its commitment to improving the downtown experience through public space activation and enhancement. This year we will begin a community-led process to develop downtown's Engaged + Energized Public Space Plan, which will explore what amenities, infrastructure, and programming are needed to support downtown's economic vibrancy for businesses and quality of life for residents.

An urban planning firm will facilitate the planning process, which will provide opportunities for the public to participate so that the people who use these spaces can tell us what they need in these spaces.

The plan will focus on three sites, which will include both Perry Square and Griswold Park. A third site will be informed by the community and involve creating a public space in an underutilized area of downtown in connection with the built environment.

Downtown's public spaces need to keep pace with private investment and the Engaged + Energized Public Space Plan will provide the road map to help evolve the downtown experience for all.
